

Our Former Area 5 Venturing President becomes National Venturing President

Friday evening, May 23rd, at the National BSA Meeting in San Diego, CA came the announcement of Venturing's new National Venturing President for 2008-2009. The National Selection





selected **Amanda Vogt**, the former 2006-2007 Central Region Area 5 Venturing President. Amanda will serve as the National Venturing President for 1 year. She will serve on the National Executive Board as the youth representative along with the National OA Chief. She will represent Venturing at events across the nation during the coming year. She plans to be at the Area 5 Committee meeting in Kansas City in October for a Venturing presentation and the September Venturing 10th Anniversary event at the Fall Fun Rally in St. Louis.

From her bio on the national venturing cabinet.org website comes the following: Serving as the 2008-2009 National Venturing President is Amanda Vogt. Amanda has previously served the Central Region as the 2007-2008 Central Region Venturing President, and as the 2006-2007 Central Region Area 5 Venturing President. In those positions, she established monthly newsletters, wrote the first set of Bylaws for an Area in the Central Region, and helped to develop the Central Region Venturing structure. She also has served her council, The Greater St. Louis Area Council, as an EVOA (Exploring/Venturing Officers Association) and a VOA (Venturing Officers Association) officer. In those positions she has served on the Venturing Recognition Night Committee, the Fall Fun Rally Committee (the largest Venturing event in the Nation), and served on the Bylaw Committee for writing new Venturing Bylaws for the Greater St. Louis Area Council. She also served as the New Horizon District VOA President.

While involved nationally now, she is keeping her boots on the ground serving Venturing Crew 2783, chartered through Salem in Ballwin United Methodist Church, in St. Louis, MO, as Recording Secretary (previously has held 4 other Crew officer positions), and as an Assistant Scoutmaster for local Boy Scout Troop 783. She is also a member of Venturing Crew 2996 chartered by Lindenwood University in St. Charles, MO. She is a 13-year member of the Girl Scouts of America through which she has earned the Girl Scout Gold Award, and the Girl Scout Silver Award, Girl Scouting's highest two awards a youth member may earn. She currently serves as a mentor for Cadette Girl Scout Troop 2356 and is a registered Girl Scout Adult Leader.

Now in her sixth year of Venturing, Amanda has lead her Venturing Crew on 6 Super Activities as an officer of her crew. These include: yacht sailing on Lake Michigan; overnight canoe trips on the Wisconsin and Buffalo Rivers; extreme mountain biking in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, Colorado, and Virginia; hiking Mount Yale in Colorado; a Philmont trek; white water rafting in Colorado, and West Virginia; horseback riding through the Colorado Rockies; diamond mining in Crater of Diamonds National Park in Arkansas; and many other adventures.


Through her many adventures with Venturing she has earned the Religious Life and Outdoor Bronze Awards, the Gold Award, the Silver Award, the Ranger Award, the Trust Award, the Council Venturing Leadership Award, the

Regional Venturing Leadership Award, and the National Venturing Leadership Award. Through her church, she has also earned the God and Life Award, the high school level God and Country Award for the United Methodist Church. She has also completed Kodiak & Kodiak X training, Sea Scout Leader Specific Training, Boy Scout Leader Specific Training, Boy Scout Leader Basic Training, and Kodiak & Kodiak X Course Director Training.

Amanda is a sophomore at Lindenwood University in St. Charles, MO, and the recipient of Lindenwood University's Boy Scout of the Year 4-year full ride Scholarship. She is majoring in Music Business and Accounting. She is a member of the Scouting based service fraternity, Alpha Phi Omega. In high school, she was involved in many scholastic activities including National Honor Society, Tri-M Music Honor Society, Renaissance, Junior Achievement, Show Choir, Chamber Choir, Symphonic Orchestra, and Theatre.

Regional Venturing Growth Plan for 2008

Plan

The National Venturing Committee, guided by the 2006-2010 BSA Strategic Plan, is committed to supporting the growth and delivery of the Venturing program in the United States. A key aspect of the National



Strategic Plan Pillar 2 states the following goal, "The number of engaged, accountable volunteers is dramatically increased at all levels of Scouting."

In accord with the National Strategic Plan, the National Venturing Council Support Committee is challenging each region to dramatically increase the number of Venturing volunteers who are delivering the Venturing program throughout America. Each region is challenged to put into place in every council a Venturing Key 3.

Council Requirements

Each council is required to recruit key Venturing leadership. Each council must identify a youth president or similar position, a Venturing volunteer chair or equivalent, and a professional responsible for Venturing. (The councils in Area 5 that had the Venturing Key 3 in place in 2007 grow Venturing on an average of over 13% last year. The councils in Area 5 that had only 1 key Venturing position or less in place on the average dropped 3% in Venturing membership in 2007.)

Having Venturing Key 3 in place in our Area 5 councils will significantly contribute to this national focus. The Area 5 Venturing Committee will be working with each council that does not have all 3 Key Venturing positions filled to help identify and train those people for your positions.

Timeline

Our goal is to have the Venturing Key 3 in place in all councils completed by summer, 2008. Sarah Ward, Area 5 Venturing President & Bob Vogt, Area 5 Venturing Chair will be contacting councils about their Venturing Key 3.

The Venturing Leadership Skills Course (VLSC) is



designed to help teach youth adults the attitudes and skills that good leaders demonstrate. Practicing and mastering these skills will help enable Venturers to have positive leadership experiences in every facet of Scouting and life. It does not matter the type of

activities a particular Crew has chosen, this is a leadership skills building course that all potential youth leaders should take to help shape their leadership styles. VLSC is a requirement for the youth to earn the Venturing Silver Award, it is a suggested course for any Venturer interested in participating on a Kodiak Trek, and is a requirement for the Advisor to earn the Advisors Award of Merit. VLSC is the first course of three offered through the Nature of Leadership Program!
