

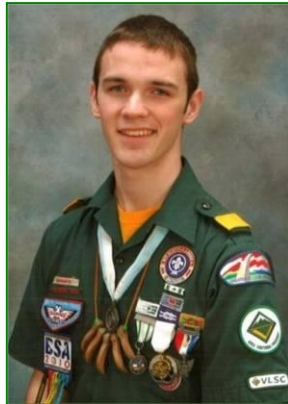

What is Powder Horn?

Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful Venturing Ranger Award or Troop High Adventure program. It does this in several ways. First it helps Venturing Leaders and Scouters to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature. It provides an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure. And it familiarizes the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer to meet the requirements of the Ranger Award. This course is based on the Venturing Ranger requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities. Scout leaders will also benefit from this course when your unit participates in unit high adventure.

Swift Base – A Venturing and Sea Scouting Paradise

Swift Base first opened the summer of 1966 at S bar F Scout Ranch about 90 miles south of St. Louis. From the beginning, it was designed to be a totally different experience for high-school and college-age members. It is one of only two bases of its type in our country and we are lucky to have it here in Area 3.



S bar F Scout Ranch is 5,200 acres of woods, trails, streams, Nims Lake and fun. The 270-acre Nims Lake serves as the focal point for water skiing, sailing, fishing, canoeing, swimming, water tubing, sun bathing, kayaking and water sliding. A herd of horses will allow you to saddle-up and explore the wilderness trails. If heights and challenges are your thing, Swift offers rock climbing, rappelling and a

high and low ropes course. Mountain bikes are available every day for rides that see no pavement. You may want to try your hand at firing a .22 rifle or bow and arrow. At Swift, you choose what you want to do.

Evening programs include campfires and dances, volleyball and crazy competitions. We plan for an outdoor movie night, drive-in style. A game night or bonfire may be in the offering. If your crew wants to take an overnight canoe float down the lake, that can be arranged. Some crews like to hike to Castle Rock to check out the stars.

All meals are served in Swift Lodge -- dining-hall style. You camp on a campsite with your crew and your leaders. Tents are set up for you on wooden frames. Each of our five campsites are scattered in the woods, so that you have shade and some privacy.

Exciting changes are coming your way for Swift in 2011! In addition to our standard Swift program of climbing, rappelling, horses, skiing, tubing, and challenge course, there will be new opportunities to really dig deep into some programs and become an "Expert" in aquatics, horseback riding, and shooting. We will be offering special opportunities during our three weeks:

June 19-25: Sea Scout/Aquatic Camp (Full)

June 26-July 2: Climbing Camp/Ranger Award Camp

July 10-16: Swift Classic

During the Aquatic week and the Climbing week, we will have experts supplementing our Swift staff. In addition we will offer many of the standard Swift high adventure activities that you are used to every week.

For 2011, reservations will be taken immediately on a first-come, first-served basis for Crews and Posts regardless of your council. In addition, Crews and Posts will be given priority for group activity sign-up on the basis of when you sign-up. First signed-up, first to choose program slots.

To assure that the facility is not overcrowded, when we reach the capacity of the camp, we will close that week to additional crews, posts, and troops. Sign-up capacity at Swift Base will be 135 campers per week. Units that procrastinate in signing up for camp greatly limit their choices.



The reservation fee is \$25.00 per camper. The \$25.00 reservation fee is refundable if requested in writing by May 2, 2011. No refunds of reservation fees after May 2.

There is no minimum number of campers necessary to make a unit reservation. We ask you to project as closely as possible your actual attendance. When units over or under estimate attendance is when we have problems.

The summer camp fee for 2011 is \$220.00 after camper savings day and \$210.00 prior to camper savings day. We encourage every crew to use the camper savings plan, which will allow the Venturers and Explorers to save on the total fee if the full fee is paid by May 2, 2011. NYLT ... It's not just for Boy Scouts anymore!

NYLT - Pack and Paddle!

Venturers can now attend the National Youth Leadership Training. It is co-ed.

National Youth Leadership Training is a weeklong training course that provides youth leaders with an opportunity to enhance their leadership skills while living by the Scout Oath and Law, in an exciting outdoor environment. Venturers who earn the NYLT shield are prepared to meet the challenges ahead and are better prepared to work with adult leaders. This is the first NYLT open for Venturers in the Greater St. Louis Area Council. The week of July 24-30, 2011 is the only Venturing NYLT Week available. The Venturing NYLT will be a Pack and Paddle course. The Pack and Paddle is an outpost adventure program that follows the NYLT syllabus. This exciting program is being held at Nims Lake, S bar F Scout Ranch. During Pack and Paddle, Venturers will practice low-impact camping, learn how to use a compass, develop leadership skills, hike, and canoe. Venturers must be able to pack all equipment in their packs including food, crew gear, shelter, and personal



items. Please take into consideration that this is a strenuous course. Venturers must be 14 or older and pass the BSA Swimmer test. To sign up for Pack and Paddle NYLT, complete the NYLT application and check the appropriate area. Space is limited to 24 Venturers.

New Venturing Award Coming May 2011 - NOVA Award

A new award program is being introduced by the BSA in May at the Annual Meeting: Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM-NOVA) Award. See attached NOVA.pdf article for more details.



STEM – NOVA Award Program: The NOVA Award program consists of individual activity elements in various STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) topics structured for either Cub Scouts or Boy Scouts/Venturers. These topics are designed for high participation and to increase interest in STEM by making it relevant and fun.

Current Topics available for the Boy Scout and Venturing NOVA Award are: Technology; Transportation; and Designed to Crunch (Mathematics).

The NOVA award will be a distinctive pocket patch with a separate pin-on device awarded for each individual topic completed by the youth.

STEM – SUPERNOVA Award Program: The SUPERNOVA Award program is similar to the BSA Hornaday Award Program. The basic requirements are to earn certain Academic Pins (Cub Scouts), Activity Badges (Webelos) and Merit Badges (Boy Scouts) plus complete various other more rigorous STEM related requirements.

The Venturing requirements are based on more independent achievement and teaching activities. SUPERNOVA is designed to encourage and recognize more in-depth achievement in STEM. Venturing recognition is the Sally Ride Award Certificate and Bronze Pocket Medal

Central Region's First National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (N.A.Y.L.E.) To Be Held Here in Area 3

Location: S Bar F Scout Ranch - 90 Minutes south of St. Louis, Missouri

Date: July 31 - August 4, 2011 (Depart on August 5 before 8am)

What is N.A.Y.L.E.?

The N.A.Y.L.E. program is an advanced version of National Youth Leadership Training (N.Y.L.T.). It is designed to provide you with a backcountry-based wilderness encounter that applies and internalizes the skills learned at your Council-level National Youth Leadership Training Course, and motivates you to follow a life of servant leadership by helping others succeed, based on Scouting's values.



Who is it for and what are the requirements?

This program is for Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, Venturers and Sea Scouts.

The requirements are:

- ◆ You must be currently registered and active in your Scouting program
- ◆ You must have completed Unit-Level Youth Leader Training
- ◆ Be a minimum of 14 years of age before the first day of the course
- ◆ Boy Scouts and Varsity Scouts: Not yet 18 years of age, and have completed NYLT
- ◆ Venturers and Sea Scouts: Not yet 21 years of age, and have completed NYLT if available in your Council (or have completed the NYLT to NAYLE Bridge Course if NYLT is not available)

- ◆ Be physically fit and approved for High Adventure on your current 2011 BSA Medical Form

What will I gain from this experience?

N.A.Y.L.E. equips youth leaders to be better Troop, Team, Crew, or Ship Leaders, NYLT Staff Members, and/or superior Camp Staff members. It will help guide your journey in leadership service to others, will enable you to develop all members of whatever teams you lead, and will provide important life skills for now and the future.

What does the course include?

- ◆ Advanced Team-Building Skills
- ◆ Geocaching
- ◆ Wilderness First Aid
- ◆ Search and Rescue
- ◆ Leave No Trace camping Skills
- ◆ Conservation
- ◆ Future Leadership Opportunities in Scouting

How much is the program?

The N.A.Y.L.E. Program cost is \$355.00, payable in full with registration. This fee covers meals, lodging, training materials, a N.A.Y.L.E. uniform cap, and 2 N.A.Y.L.E. uniform t-shirts. Participants are responsible for personal and camping gear. Detailed information, Packing List, and Leadership Survey will be provided upon registration.

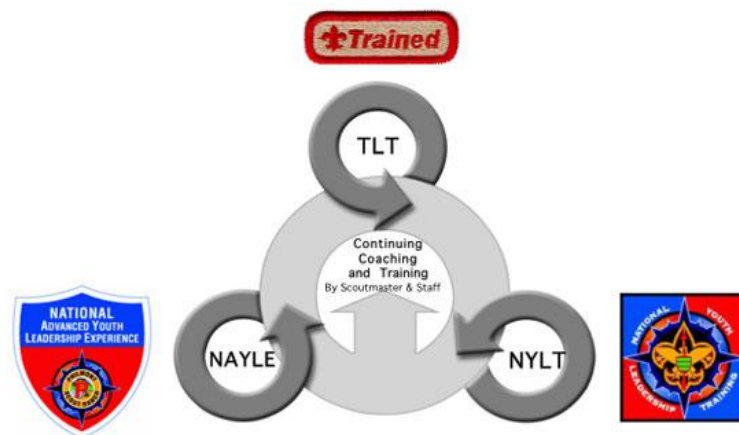
