The Third Annual Central Region Area 3 Venturing Conference took place on January 13-14th, 2012 in Normal, Illinois. This year's conference started off on a cool Friday evening with a little bit of snow. With both an Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews Course (ILSC) and Venturing Leader Specific Training (VLST) being offered the conference started out earlier than the first two Venturing Conferences. The ILSC had 7 youth participates who are now very eager to put on the course back in their own councils. The VLST had 3 adults become trained. Saturday

started out early and was filled with many different courses available. A total of 71 participants and staff were present throughout the day from 6 different states. A Kodiak Challenge Course Directors Course (CDC) along with 15 other courses was available throughout the day.



During the closing, the National Venturing President, Dan Carriveau, presented the first Area Venturing

Leadership Awards in the nation to seven recipients including Dustin Readenour, the Central Region Venturing President and myself. What is Powder Horn?

Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful Venturing Ranger Award or Troop High Adventure program.



It does this in several ways. First it helps Venturing Leaders and Scouters to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature. It provides an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure. And it familiarizes the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer to meet the requirements of the Ranger Award. This course is based on the Venturing Ranger requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities. Scout leaders will also benefit from this course when your unit participates in unit high adventure.

Swift Base - Three Weeks of FUN!

Swift Base first opened the summer of 1966 at S bar F Scout Ranch. From the beginning, it was designed to be a totally different experience for high-school and college-age members. It is one of only two bases of its type in our country. And the Greater St. Louis Area Council is lucky to have it here in Area 3! S bar F Scout Ranch is 5.200 acres of woods, trails. streams, Nims Lake and fun. Our 270-arce Nims Lake serves as the focal point for water skiing, sailing, fishing, canoeing, swimming, water tubing, sun bathing, kayaking and water sliding. Our herd of horses will allow you to saddle-up and explore the wilderness trails. If heights and challenges are your thing, we offer rock climbing, rappelling and a high and low ropes course. Mountain bikes are available every day for rides that see no pavement. You may want to try your hand at firing a .22 rifle or bow and arrow. At Swift, you choose what you want to do. All meals are served in Swift Lodge, dining hall style. Your crew will camp on a campsite with your crew and leader. Tents are set up for you on wooden frames. There are five campsites that are scattered in the woods, so that the crews have shade and some privacy. Swift Base is located at S bar F in Knob Lick, Missouri. There are three weeks available this summer for Venturers. All of them are specialty weeks meaning that they will focus more are certain themes for the week, but classic activities will still be available during each week.

Lindenwood has awarded the Boy Scouts of America over \$250,000 in scholarships for the upcoming school year to recognize outstanding youth. The three levels of scholarships range from \$5,000 to \$12,000 per year, or \$20,000 to \$48,000 (excluding an allotted \$2,400 earned in the work and

learn program) over a four-year period. Different scholarships depend on if you have the Eagle Scout Award, Venturing Silver Award, or Quartermaster Award. Things that they look for are service in and out of the Boy Scouts of America.

With its main campus in St. Charles, Missouri, Lindenwood is a four-year co-educational, liberal arts university. Lindenwood promotes the importance of a value-oriented culture and education for all of its students. Lindenwood houses more than 4,500 residential students and educates nearly 15,000 total students each academic year.

Lindenwood offers more than 120 undergraduate and graduate degrees and regardless of the student's intended major, the scholarships are available to them because of their service with the Boy Scouts of America. Venturing Leadership Award

Do you know of a youth who has shown outstanding leadership to the Venturing Program and in their community? Have they been recognized with the Venturing Leadership Award yet? Well they should be. Please make the effort to recognize the youth who help the Venturing program succeed at the Council (Crew and District included), Area, Regional, and National level with the Venturing Leadership Award this year. Here are the steps for recognizing these deserving youth:

- 1. Form a selection committee in your council and ask other units to submit their nominations by a certain date
- 2. Figure out how many of the awards your council is allowed to present each year (2 for the first 50 crews in the council, 1 per additional fraction of 25)
- 3. Discuss which nominees are most deserving of the award and make your selection
- 4. Create a Council Venturing Recognition Event or present them at your Council's Annual Dinner.
