

Program Changes

Who is excited for the new changes to the Venturing program? Well, if you haven't heard, Venturing is getting a brand new makeover, starting this month. The final details will be released at the National Annual Meeting, but here is what we know so far:

- 1) Venturers will start using the Scout Oath, Law, Sign, and Salute. This is part of the BSA's goal to have all of its programs united under more than just the same organization.
- 2) The new awards structure will feature the four pillars of Venturing: Adventure, Service, Leadership, and Personal Growth. There will be 4 awards and must be earned in succession. They are the Venturing Award, Discovery Award, Pathfinder Award, and the Summit Award. These new awards are designed to help improve the program of all Venturing Crews in America.
- 3) The National Council is committed to improving the Venturing Program and is excited to get feedback from Venturers across the nation.

ATTENTION: The Venturing Bronze Awards, Gold Award, and Silver Award will be retired in December of 2014! This is your last chance to ever earn these coveted awards, and it is not too late. As long as you have been a Venturer since 2013, you can still earn your Silver Award. Even if you have earned your Silver Award, or if you are a new Venturer, you can still earn any of the 5 Venturing Bronze Awards. If your goal is to earn the Venturing Silver Award before it is retired in December, here is a run-down of what you need to do:

1. Find a Bronze Award that interests you and start working on it. Your options are Arts & Hobbies, Outdoors, Religious Life, Sports, or Sea Scouts.
2. While working on a Bronze Award, set your 6 goals for the Venturing Gold Award.
3. Find leadership positions in your Crew and in other organizations to start developing your leadership skills for the leadership requirements for the Gold and Silver Awards.
4. Attend the Area 7 Venturing Extravaganza, October 3rd- 5th at Rainbow Scout Reservation in Morris, IL for a day full of Hunger Games fun, or any District or Council Venturing event.
5. Complete some basic trainings including Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews, First Aid, CPR, and BSA Safe Swim Defense.
6. Have FUN! Venturing is an amazing program that has evolved so that Venturers can have fun! Don't forget the fun!





2014 BSA NATIONAL MEETING, NASHVILLE, TN (CONTD)

The prototypes of the new Venturing Awards were revealed at the Venturing booth at the BSA National Meeting in Nashville, TN.



The first three would be shiny and powder-coated, and the yellow would be the real Venturing yellow — which didn't come out well in the prototype. The Summit award (far right) would be bright chrome with reflective black enamel.



CAMPFIRE S'MORES IN A CONE

Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup milk chocolate chips, or more to taste
- 12 ice cream cones
- 1/2 cup miniature marshmallows, or more to taste
- 12 12x12-inch squares of heavy-duty aluminum foil

1. Place about 1 teaspoon chocolate chips into an ice cream cone, followed by a layer of mini marshmallows. Continue layering chips and marshmallows into the cone until full. Repeat with remaining chips, marshmallows, and cones.
2. Wrap each cone tightly in aluminum foil.
3. Heat the foil-wrapped cones in a campfire until chocolate and marshmallows are melted, 3 to 5 minutes.
